## **ORDINANCE NO. 98-19**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 98-16, EXPANDING THE URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY BOARD TO INCLUDE A SANDY FIRE DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVE AND A SANDY BUSINESS REPRESENTATIVE.

WHEREAS, The City Council on October 19, 1998, adopted ordinance 98-16, creating an urban renewal agency; and

WHEREAS, on November 30, 1998, the City Council met in joint session with the Board of Directors of Sandy Fire District #72 to discuss the urban renewal agency and issues relating to the adoption of an urban renewal plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council and Fire District Board desire to amend the composition of the urban renewal agency;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SANDY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 2 of Ordinance 98-16 is amended to read:

Section 2. The powers of the urban renewal agency of the City of Sandy as set forth in ORS Chapter 457 shall be exercised by the Sandy City Council, acting as the urban renewal agency of the City of Sandy, with the addition of two voting members: a representative of the Sandy Fire District and a representative of a business within an urban renewal district, both to be appointed by the City Council. Any act of the Sandy City Council acting as the urban renewal agency shall be considered the act of the urban renewal agency only and not of the Sandy City Council.

THIS ORDINANCE IS ADOPTED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR THIS FOURTH DAY OF JANUARY, 1999.
